


FAMILY GOES MISSING

FLORIDA MAN DEEMED "TOO ANGRY TO DIE" MEDICAL PROFESSIONALS LEFT BAFFLED

In a story baffling doctors and concerning neighbors, 87-year-old Carl "Grumps" Henderson has been declared "too angry to die." The local legend, known for his fiery rants about everything from rising lap dance prices at the Bare Assets to the modern decline of deli meat quality from Publix, appears to be fueled entirely by sheer indignation.



BRIGHTLINE TRAIN CLAIMS 3RD VICTIM THIS YEAR IN INDIAN COUNTY

VERO BEACH - A Brightline train collided with yet another pedestrian near the I2th Street railroad crossing, located between US I and Old Dixie Highway, prompting a response from the Indian River County Sheriff's Office.

Fire rescue personnel arrived on the scene and pronounced the pedestrian dead. Authorities are withholding the individual's identity until next of kin have been notified.

Criminal Investigations Detectives, alongside Brightline railroad officials, are conducting a thorough investigation into the incident. Details on if the level crossings signals - which include flashing red lights and an alarm - and the crossing arms were working properly were not immediately available. This is the 3rd incident this year in Indian River County.

Firestorm in Brevard: 100 Firefighters Quit Amid Explosive Contract Standoff

Nearly 100 Brevard County firefighters have quit, retired, or joined other agencies offering better pay, according to the union. Months of stalled contract negotiations have left firefighters seeking fair wages elsewhere.

"Nobody's asking to become millionaires. They're just asking to get paid a reasonable wage," said a union spokesperson. The mass exodus has sparked concerns about the county's ability to maintain emergency services.

CONSTRUCTION ACCIDENT LEAVES 1 WORKER DEAD




Authorities from the Palm Bay Police Department are conducting an investigation to understand how the incident occurred.






Go to your app store




Search for QR code scanners



Download your favorite one




Hit install



Once installed, leave the app store, go back to your home menu and type in the search bar "files"




Open the downloads option




Find your downloaded Post 9 Report PDF
